Next you will see information about the Health Professions Advising team. And, this is actually a link for you to sign up for a Nursing Academic Advising Workshop. We, work with Nursing Students in a group format.

Please review this information to select the type of workshop you will want to attend.

Next, follow these instructions to sign up.

Enter your L number and your Date of Birth.

Select the workshop type.

Choose the date and time that will work for you.

Please be sure to print the workshop location as these do vary.

Typically the group size is anywhere from 1 person to up to 10 depending on the time of the year.

You will see here that we have the Latest News section with announcements that we send to students who are what we call "enrolled in this course." To be enrolled in this course you go up here to the administration box.

Choose this link here. Enter your L number and PIN - you will be enrolled for one academic year. This is a free resource. You will see it listed in your "myCourses" section when you sign in to Moodle. However, it will not appear on your Lane transcript.

In Section 1, you will find the most recent application to the Nursing Program. Please carefully review the application for the year that you are applying.



In Section 2, this is information for new and prospective students who plan to attend Lane. Here you will find the Academic Advising Guide and Term by Term sample planner. You can save the Advising Guide to your computer to use like a checklist or to enter your own term by term plan. You can also send your completed plan by email or upload here in the Storage bank for Term by Term Planners. This will allow you to request feedback from us.

In Section 3 is information about Oregon Health Sciences University. We are a member of the Oregon Consortium for Nursing Education. Community college students who attend a O C N E institution are allowed to progress toward Bachelor Degree completion through Oregon Health Sciences University to finish the last year of the their education through a distance learning model.

Section 4 Takes you to the Lane Transfer Tool. Information is provided to help students take steps toward determining how courses from prior institutions can be used to meet application or program requirements.

This is the Transfer Advising Guide. It provides detailed step by step instructions to assist you as your take steps to determine how the courses you haveve taken can be used to meet program or application requirements. Along with this you will use the Lane Transfer Tool.

If you see a course in the Lane Transfer Tool as equivalent to a course that is listed in the Nursing Advising Guide no further steps are required. If your course appears equivalent to a 1 x x or 2 x x course this means that it is considered a freshman or sophomore level course. What is unknown is how the course can be used for the Nursing application process. If you have questions please email us. We may then direct you to contact appropriate instructors or departments to continue to obtain course equivalencies.

Once you have obtained the appropriate documentation from an instructional department you will be able to use this in your program application to meet the specific requirement that the equivalency is written for.

In Section 5 Educational Pathways, Career and Licensing Information. You will find Carrer and scholarship information. You can also find contact information for all of the nursing schools in Oregon or throughout the U S. Here is an example.

Oregon Career Information System is licensed through the University of Oregon for Lane students to use. Students who sign in with the user name and the password are eligible to have access to all the information provided - not just for nursing but a wide range of options for completing your education towards a large variety of careers. Section 6, the website for Lane Community College Student Nurses' Association. Students are eligible to participate in the association even if you are not yet admitted into a nursing program.



Section 7, has Licensed Practical Nurse information. There are two program options. L P N only or the L P N to R N Bridge. This section will be updated as information becomes available. Enrolled students in this resource will be sent an email notification when the updates have been added

Section 8, provides Academic Advising support for students who are planning to apply to the two year Associate of Applied Science R N Program.

In one of the remaining sections you will see information about Lane Campus Resources. This is a great way to get familiar with what is available for you as a student here at Lane and to help you be successful.
