SENTENCE FRAGMENTS

Identifying and Correcting Fragments

Essential parts of a sentence:

- Subjects
 - Name a person, place, thing or idea that the sentence is about.
 - Must be a noun or pronoun
- Verbs
 - Tell the reader something about the subject
 - Tell what the subject does
 - Tell the condition of the subject
- Complete thought does not leave reader "hanging"

What are Fragments?

- □ Part of a sentence a fragment of a sentence
- Incomplete
- Missing one or more essential part:
 - Missing a verb or part of a verb
 - Missing a subject
 - Does not express a complete thought

Examples of Fragments

- Phrases does not contain both subject and verb
 - (After speech class) (in the cafeteria.)
 - (At the podium) (for her presentation.)
 - Using I-language (with her partner.)
 - Was speaking very clearly.
 - Martina (from my class) (at LCC.)

Additional Examples

- Dependent Clauses
 - Contains a subject and complete verb but does not express a complete thought
 - Leaves reader "hanging"
 - Cannot stand alone as an independent sentence.
- Examples
 - When the presentation was over.
 - The instructor who explained communication strategies.
 - Which was why they communicated well.

Correcting Fragments

- Join with another sentence or clause
- Add a subject
- Add a verb or make the verb complete
- Add an independent clause

Correcting Fragments: Examples

- (At the podium) (for her presentation.) fragment
- She stood (at the podium) (for her presentation.) sentence

- Martina (from my class) (at LCC.) fragment
- Was speaking very clearly. fragment
- Martina (from my class) (at LCC) was speaking very clearly. sentence

Correcting Fragments: More Examples

- When the <u>presentation</u> was over. fragment
- We clapped. sentence
- When the <u>presentation</u> was over, <u>we</u> clapped. sentence

- The instructor <u>who</u> explained communication strategies. fragment
- The instructor is also the debate team coach. sentence
- The <u>instructor</u> <u>who</u> explained communication strategies is also the debate team coach.

Summary
