LANE NURSING – an applicant admitted to a community college Oregon Consortium for Nursing Education (OCNE) partner is considered co-admitted to Oregon Health Sciences University with an option to complete a Bachelors degree with a major in Nursing. All applicants must meet Lane <u>Oregon Residency</u> requirements.

<u>Phase 1</u>: LPN applicants are screened for eligibility to enroll in the pharmacology and pathophysiology series using the point system as outlined on the point petition sheet – see Form 2. The number of applicants selected will be based on the available capacity in these two course sequences for Winter term 2013, selection does not guarantee admission to the nursing program.

<u>Phase 2</u>: Selection for admission or alternate status combines the points obtained in Phase 1 (Form 2) with up to 10 points for grades completed in Pharmacology 1 NRS 230 and Pathophysiology 1 NRS 232. Patho/Pharm II must be completed with a C or better in order to maintain selection or alternate status. Applicants may apply for advanced placement in any OCNE partner program, or for slots in one or more OCNE partner programs of their choice.

<u>Phase 3</u>: Selection for admission or alternate status is based on point ranking and allows students to complete the Bridge course NRS 115. Students will be required to complete NRS 115 with a C or better to enroll in the first-term second year of an OCNE RN program NRS 221A and B. ### 2013 APPLICATION PROCESS:

1. Admission to Lane.

If you are not currently a Lane credit student, complete <u>Lane's college credit admission process</u> choose start term as Winter 2013 and obtain a student "L" number. Make sure to complete all "<u>Steps to Enroll in Credit Classes</u>" including a prior college clearance (see Steps to Enroll for more information).

- 2. The LPN to RN Application Phase 1 has two parts an On-line Application & Payment, and written application Forms 1 and 2. You are NOT considered an applicant to the program until you meet all application requirements.
  - A. Instructions for the On-line Application and Payment follow the form pages. This application will include a \$50 non-refundable application fee, therefore do not initiate until you are sure you will have the prerequisites and requirements met, submit official sealed Transcripts (if needed) and are ready to submit Forms 1 and 2.
  - B. Email LPN to RN Nursing Application Winter 2013 Phase 1 Forms 1 and 2 and documentation as instructed. Applications must be received by deadline. If needed mail course equivalency or substitution forms, medical terminology syllabus, OSBN LPN License Verification, work verification forms, Advanced Placement Reference forms to HP Application Center. 3. Oregon LPN License, Work Experience and Reference Documents

Attach a copy from the OSBN website of verification of an unencumbered Oregon LPN License (available from the <u>Oregon State Board of Nursing</u>) - along with the <u>LPN Work Experience</u> forms signed by appropriate individuals sealed in their agency envelope and two completed copies of the <u>OCNE LPN to RN Advanced Placement Reference</u> forms sealed by the reference sources in their agency envelopes.

4. National Standardized Exam (from ATI) (Required prior to application.)

PREREQUISITE COMPETENCIES. Must receive a GPA of 3.00 or higher on all prerequisites listed on Form 2. All course work must appear on a Lane Transcript and/or submitted transcripts from other schools.

- 30 credits of specified prerequisite courses (listed below items 1-8 to meet credit total) must be completed before the application deadline. However, must be on track to complete by the end of Fall term 45 credits that include all courses listed on Form 2 plus BI 112 (<u>Biology with Genetics requirement</u>) and BI 234 and WR 123 or 227 for students who completed WR 121 or WR 122 prior to Summer term 2010.
- All courses letter grade C- or higher; see courses with Pass option on Form 2.
- Any courses completed that meet the criteria as OCNE prerequisites must be included on Petition for Points
  Form 2, up to 47 credits. Applicants may repeat courses in order to raise the GPA. The most recent grade
  will be used for GPA calculation whether it is higher or lower than previous grades.
- Applicants with courses taken at other colleges please refer to the <u>Course Equivalency information</u> and the Transfer Advising Guide.
- 1. Anatomy & Physiology I, II, III: (12 credits) BI 231 is required to apply. BI 232 and 233 are required to enroll in NRS 230 and NRS 232. BI 112 and CH 112 are prerequisite to BI 231 at Lane. These 6 credits may be used as approved electives toward the 45 credits Winter entry requirements. If course(s) were not taken at Lane, use the Lane Transfer Tool or request a course equivalency from the Science department. The most recent A&P course must have been completed within 7 years prior to starting the LPN Advanced Placement Program (taken Winter term 2006 or later). If all three AP courses are more than 7 years old BI 233 needs to be completed Winter term 2006 or later.
- 2. MTH 095 or higher, 4-5 Credits Pass grade or grade of C- or higher. If taken Math courses numbered 100 or higher or courses considered freshman level or above meet criteria. If no qualifying math course completed Lane Math Placement Test into MTH 105 or MTH 111. Testing must be completed prior to the application deadline. Math placement testing is not an option if you have a taken MTH 95 or higher with a passing grade. MTH 95 competency by placement testing does not count toward the 30 prerequisite credits.

3. English Composition Courses WR 121 and WR 122 (6 to 8 credits) Applicants with a prior Bachelor's degree from a U.S. regionally accredited institution may waive this requirement. Students who have completed a U.S. Bachelor's degree and wish to waive the WR 121 & 122 requirement will need to complete additional approved electives to fulfill the 45 course credits required for admission to the program. Additional credits may come from any approved courses listed under item 8.

For applicants without a prior Bachelors who have taken college level freshman writing courses not listed as "WR 121" or "WR 122" use the <u>Lane Transfer Tool</u> or request a course equivalency from Lane's Language, Literature & Communication Division.

Students without a Bachelor's degree and who have completed WR 121 or WR 122 prior to Summer term 2010 are required complete WR 123 or WR 227 to meet the composition degree requirement. WR 123 or 227 can be listed as an approved elective course.

- Nutrition FN 225 (3 or 4 credits). If course not taken at Lane use the <u>Lane Transfer Tool</u> or request a course equivalency from the Health Professions division. FN 225 or equivalent course is required to enroll in NRS 230 and NRS 232.
- 5. Human Development (3 credits)

The course must cover the developmental process of human life covering the full life span, (not just Child Development). One course option must be met to enroll in NRS 230 and NRS 232.

- Options at Lane include: PSY 215; or HDFS 226 + PSY 236; or PSY 235 + PSY 236.
- At Lane, the prerequisite is PSY 201 which can be used as social science credits. If course(s) not taken at Lane use the <a href="Lane Transfer Tool">Lane Transfer Tool</a> or request a course equivalency from the Social Science department.
- 6. Human Relations course (3 or 4 credits) See <u>Lane Catalog Associate of Applied Science Human Relations</u> requirement. See course list option. If course not taken at Lane use the <u>Lane Transfer Tool</u> or request a course equivalency from the Counseling Department.
- Arts and Letters, Social Science or Science/Math Computer Science (3 or 4 credits). See Lane Catalog Associate
  of Applied Science <u>Discipline Studies</u> requirement. See course subject options. If, course meets the subject
  criteria and is from an accredited institution numbered 100 level or higher or considered freshman level or above
  then no further steps are required.
- 8. Approved Electives to total of 45 to 47 credits. See Lane Catalog <u>Associate of Applied Science Discipline Studies</u> course subject options listed under Arts/Letters (excluding studio art and performance arts); Human Relations/Social Science; Science/Math/Computer Science. If, course(s) meet the subject criteria and are from an accredited institution numbered 100 level or higher or considered freshman to senior level then no further steps are required. No more than two courses in the same subject area can be listed (e.g. only two ENG courses.)
- 9. Microbiology BI 234 and Biology with Genetics courses (see <u>Lane Catalog Information</u>) are required to be completed prior to enrollment in NRS 230 and NRS 232.
- 10. Basic Computer Competency is required to enroll in NRS 230 and NRS 232. To be successful in the LPN to RN Program students need to be computer literate, including at least word processing, use of spreadsheets, and web searches. Students without computer experience are expected to seek out opportunities for remediation in this competency prior to entering the LPN Advanced Placement Program. Basic computer competency is assessed during the essay process and throughout the nursing courses.

## **TRANSCRIPTS**

Submit Transcripts (if required) to Enrollment Services. All courses used for points must appear on your transcript.

- <u>Do not</u> submit transcripts from Lane Community College to Enrollment Services or the HP Application Center.

- If official transcripts are received at the Health Professions Application Center, they will NOT be forwarded to Enrollment Services.

# TRANSFER CREDITS, COURSE EQUIVALENCIES

Courses taken at other colleges may be eligible for use in the application process. Use the following steps and make sure to consult with a program advisor/counselor.

DO NOT DELAY. It is <u>your responsibility</u> to initiate the process early and make sure it has been completed by the application deadline. IMPORTANT. Equivalencies must meet both <u>Core Program</u> and <u>AAS degree</u> requirements and <u>program requirements</u>.

- 1. For colleges other than Lane, submit an official, sealed transcript to Enrollment Services. College transcripts received by Lane's Enrollment Services may be verified in <u>myLane</u>. Select the myEnrollment tab.
- 2. Go to the Enrollment Services website Lane Transfer Tool.
- 3. Review "General Information for Transferring Credits."
- 4. Select "Look up Transferable Credits" to check on transferable classes for items 1-6 Form 2. If your course(s) are listed as equivalent to course numbers and titles as listed above no further action is needed.
- 5. If the college/course is not shown see instructions provided above in items 1-9 (pages 2-3)
  - If you obtain course equivalencies or substitutions request copy of the approval in-person or by email.
  - Course equivalencies must be approved and received in Enrollment Services by your date of application.

Courses from Non-accredited colleges will not be considered in the initial evaluation of your application nor can they be considered toward any application or degree requirements.

### Transfer coursework from Foreign Institutions

Must be evaluated by the application deadline by an outside credential evaluation service. The evaluation company must be either AACRAO Foreign Education Credential Service (www.aacrao.org) or a member of the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES). For a list of NACES memberships, please refer to their web site at www.naces.org. The evaluation must be a course-by-course detailed evaluation with an official copy submitted to Enrollment Services. The coursework must be considered to be at a post-secondary level, have comparable LANE accreditation status and be parallel in content to LANE coursework. The outside evaluation must also be completed for secondary level education for any evaluation of that coursework toward LANE admission requirements. ### APPLICATION POINT SYSTEM - PLEASE REVIEW CAREFULLY

PER OCNE RULES, APPLICATION POINTS WILL NOT BE MADE AVAILABLE TO APPLICANTS. Eligible applicants will be assessed according to the following point system. The majority of this point system is uniform in all OCNE programs with each school having up to 14 discretionary points.

- SECTION 3: Prerequisite GPA: A maximum of 40 points will be awarded.
   The applicant must detail the meeting of these prerequisites on the Point Petition Sheet and submit official transcript(s) from accredited colleges or universities for all prerequisites. See Transcripts and Transfer Credits, Course Equivalency sections. Only the prerequisite courses will be counted in the application GPA.
- 2. SECTION 4: Grade in Anatomy and Physiology: A maximum of 5 points will be awarded to the grade for AP 1 BI 231. If the course was repeated the points will be awarded on the most recent grade for that course. Grade of A or B = 5 points. Grade of C = 0 points. The total points possible from Section 4 is 46.
- 3. SECTION 4: National Standardized Test: up to 20 points will be awarded for scores on the ATI Step exam. Call Health Professions Department 541-463-5730 to set up the proctored exam. Dates and located TBA. Scores are provided based on percentile ranking compared with a normative group. To calculate points convert the percentile rank to the decimal form and then multiply it by 20 (e.g. 84% = .84 x 20 = 16.8 points).
- 4. SECTION 4: Submit in sealed envelopes Advanced Placement References (two are required to apply). Range of References points is 10 18 points Reference Documents Submit two Agency References as <u>LPN Advanced Placement Reference Documents</u>. Use form provided and these must be submitted by date of application. An applicant with fewer than 10 points will not be eligible to apply. Information about points awarded from references will not be made available to students.
- 5. SECTION 4: Prior College Degree Applicants who hold a prior degree and have the degree documented on their transcripts will receive the following points. These are the OCNE standard points for prior degrees.
  - Associate Degree (1 point)
  - Bachelor's Degree (2 points)
  - Masters or higher degree (3 points)

For the Winter 2014 LPN to RN Advanced Placement application Prior Degree – Associates Degree or higher will only receive 1 point.

SECTION 5: Discretionary points at Lane: Items 6-8 below. Up to 14 Discretionary Points are available. Lane is using two points for the grade of A or B in Section 1 of Form 2. Therefore 12 points can be earned in Section 5.

- 6. SECTION 5: Practical Nurse Program points applicants must submit a transcript that shows their grades earned in an LPN program that qualified them to sit for their LPN licensing exam to Enrollment Services by date of application. Students who attended non accredited institutions should mail their transcripts to the HP Application Center. If the Grade Point Average earned from LPN course work is a 3.00 or higher the applicant will be eligible to earn 2 points.
- 7. SECTION 5: Lane County Residence: 4 points Lane County residency for 90 days prior to applying, choose <u>Towns Considered for Lane County Residence</u> for a list of towns outside of Eugene/Springfield. This will be assessed by the street address of the applicant. No PO Boxes. Make sure address is also listed in Form 2. No other documentation is required. See <u>Residency rules</u> for Lane Community College.
- 8. SECTION 5: Prerequisite course work completed at Lane listed on Form 2 Sections 1 and 2 completed at Lane. If 24-35 credits = 1 point and if 36 or more credits = 2 points.
- 9. Diversity Course 2points see <u>Lane Catalog</u> courses marked with an asterisk \*. Additional course options include HO 102 Diversity Issues in Health Care or HE 255 Global Health. If course not taken at Lane use the <u>Lane Transfer Tool</u> or email <u>NursingProgram@lanecc.edu</u> for assistance.

10. Medical Terminology – 2 points - minimum of two credits. Pass or grade of C or higher. If course not taken at Lane use the <u>Lane Transfer Tool</u> or submit course syllabus to HP Application Center. Attn: Nursing Application Documentation 4000 East 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Eugene, OR 97405.

# Additional Requirements: Points not assigned. SECTION 6

- 11. Oregon unencumbered LPN License through the Oregon State Board of Nursing. Applicants will be required to submit verification. See Form 2. Email PDF provided by the OSBN site to <a href="https://example.com/HPApplicationCenter@lanecc.edu">HPApplicationCenter@lanecc.edu</a> attention LPN License Verification for Student Name and L number by date of application.
- 12. LPN Work Experience Practice as an LPN Documented 500 hours or more are required to apply <u>see directions</u> <u>provided</u> prior to the application deadline. Submit verification in Agency envelopes by date of application. No points are awarded. An additional 500 hours will be required (total of 1000 hours) prior to end of the summer NRS 115 A and B courses and enrollment in NRS 221 OCNE RN second year.

# **DEMANDS OF THE PROGRAM**

It is important to understand the mental and physical demands of the nursing program and the career of the nurse. Applicants to the nursing programmust be physically and mentally able to cope with the rigors of the curriculum and the demanding nature of the health professions. Nursing students must be able to grasp scientific concepts, set up and answer basic math and algebra problems, and communicate well verbally and in writing. Physically, students must be able to remain on their feet for extended periods, lift up to 25 pounds, hear heart and breath sounds, read fine print and identify skin tones such as pale, ashen, gray or bluish.

Established academic and clinical requirements essential to the program of instruction apply to all students and cannot be waived. Attempts will be made to accommodate and retain qualified applicants with disabilities unless results of evaluations indicate that given reasonable accommodation an individual will still be unable to perform the essential functions required by the program.

### AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

### **BSN DEGREE OPTION**

Successful completion of the LPN Advanced Placement Program allows acceptance to the nursing program and coadmission to Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU) Baccalaureate Nursing program. This allows Lane nursing students' eligibility to complete a BS degree in Nursing from OHSU without an additional competitive application process. Options available for Baccalaureate completion can be found at Oregon Health Sciences University.

# NEW OHSU Requirement for Transition from Lane to OHSU.

From OHSU: "Students should understand that although co-admitted to the Oregon Health & Science University School of Nursing, those who choose to transition from the Lane Community College Nursing Program to OHSU will have to undergo a Criminal Background Check for OHSU at the <u>time of transition</u> and ability to enroll in OHSU courses may be negatively impacted by any criminal history in their background."

# ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS, COURSES & COMPETENCIES FOR BS DEGREE:

- 1. Completion of additional courses including Statistics (MTH 243), Epidemiology, and 15 credits of upper division Humanities, Social or Natural Sciences.
- 2. Foreign Language Proficiency Language proficiency is a requirement for graduation with the bachelor's degree. This requirement can be met by:
  - a) Two years of the same high school language
  - b) A language proficiency examination
  - c) Two terms (quarters or semesters) of the same college level language. These credits could count toward the 45 prerequisite credits as well as the AAS and BS degree credits.
  - d) American Sign Language is an accepted language to meet the requirement.
