	<p>Application deadline: Early Spring term – see posted deadline.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Application forms, point sheets and transcripts must be submitted by posted deadline dates • Online forms. Payment and Winter term 2013 transcripts from colleges other than Lane must be submitted by posted deadline date.
	<p>Minimum Application Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish an email account • Be an Oregon resident – by Lane definition. • Complete Lane's application process. • Review all application materials and complete Physical Therapist Assistant application process. • Complete the following courses – WR 121, HO 100, meet math minimum requirement – see below, HO 150 and PSY 201 to apply. • All courses for points must appear on a Lane Transcript by date of application. Courses from other institutions must meet course equivalency requirements and appear on submitted transcripts. • Complete 25 hours of PT or PTA observation in a clinical setting • Complete a personal statement based on a topic provided in the application • Application and point criteria information will be provided in the Fall 2013 application materials.
	<p>Fall Entry requirements in addition to the above listed courses include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attend the mandatory orientation for accepted and alternate students • Provide required documentation as described in the acceptance notification
	<p>Grade requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All courses meeting application and program requirements must be graded C or higher. Courses with a grade of C- or less will not meet application or program requirements. Points will be awarded in the application for completion of the following courses: HO 100, WR 121, PSY 201, HO 150 or BI 231, and MTH 095. A's will be worth more than B's and B's worth more than C's. BI 231 will be worth more points than HO 150. Observation hours from 50 to 100 will be awarded more points than the 25 hour minimum.
	<p>*The following courses can be completed prior to entry into the program.</p>
	<p>Writing requirement to apply: WR 121 Introduction to Academic Writing. Prerequisite WR 115 Introduction to College Writing or pass Lane reading and writing placement tests.</p>
	<p>Math requirement to apply: Complete Math Placement testing or course work that will allow you to enter MTH 095 Fall term first year in the program. Math program requirement is: MTH 095 Intermediate Algebra or higher</p>
	<p>Math 095 program requirement: will be awarded additional points in the application process</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • *MTH 095 Intermediate Algebra 5 credits or higher math with 4 credits – MTH 095 Prerequisite course options are MTH 065 Elementary Algebra or MTH 070 Introductory Algebra or equivalent content with a grade of C or better or pass Lane placement test part E.
	<p>Medical Terminology required to apply:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HO 100 Medical Terminology
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HO 150 required to apply: Human Body Systems 1 – recommended prerequisite is HO 100. BI 231 – Human Anatomy and Physiology 1 can be used as a substitute for HO 150 and will be awarded more points in the application. BI 232 and 233 can be substituted for HO 152. • *HO 152 program requirement: Human Body Systems 2 – prerequisite is HO 150
	<p>Prerequisites for BI 231 if you choose this option.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BI 112/CH 112 "Biobonds" Cell Biology and Chemistry for Health Occupations. BI112/CH112 "Biobonds" prerequisite is completion of MTH 052 or higher or passing Lane placement tests parts D, E or F.
	<p>Human Relations program requirement: Select from list page 48 of Lane Catalog</p>
	<p>Social Science requirement to apply: PSY 201 or PSY 202 – General Psychology courses – Recommended prerequisite is WR 115 or higher or placement test into WR 121. PSY 201 is the recommended prerequisite for PSY 202.</p>
	<p>Health program requirement: *HE 262 First Aid II – Beyond the Basics</p>
	<p>Speech requirement: *SP 115 Intercultural Communication</p>
	<p>Observation Hours: 25 are required to apply – additional points for hours up to 100. See application materials for specific criteria and guidance.</p>
	<p>Submit all forms by posted deadline. This may include: Application Point sheet, Proof of Observation hours and Transcripts.</p>
